Our message is not primarily to those who do not want to believe, but to those who do want to believe and are unsure of what to believe



Evangelism, for the most part, is a non-confrontational ministry. We are called to harvest the ripened fruit, with a careful touch and loving tug, allowing the timing of God to cause souls to fall off the vine into our hands. When we find souls not ready for the harvest, we are called to cultivate the soil, water the seed, and fertilize the plant, taking care not to bruise the un-ripened fruit. The analogy God has given for soul harvest makes us responsible to be good stewards in the fields of God's service. No one has been given authority to disregard a field, uproot the seed, or damage the crop. When we encounter a person whose heart is unprepared to receive Christ, we should take care to leave that person with a good experience of having been witnessed to by a loving servant, who is but a vinedresser for the Master. Our message is not primarily to those who do not want to believe, but to those who do want to believe and are unsure of what to believe.
