The book of Numbers, chapters thirteen and fourteen, tells the story of twelve men who all saw the same thing and gave voice to their perspectives. Ten of those men talked only about the problem while two, Joshua and Caleb spoke the promises. In the end, God declared that what he had heard each of them say is how their life would unfold. What do you see, promises or problems?
