As we mature, we should begin to see life and its many situations from a different perspective. Paul and Silas were thrown in prison for preaching the Gospel. It was terrible, dark, wet, stinky, and gloomy. It would have been easy to give up. Sure, prison affected Paul, but he realized that it might not be all about him. They decided to praise God in their difficulty. God responded and shook the earth, opened the prison doors, and many believed and were saved, including the jailer and his whole family. Sometimes things affect us when it's not about us.
